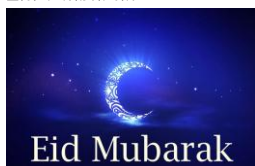

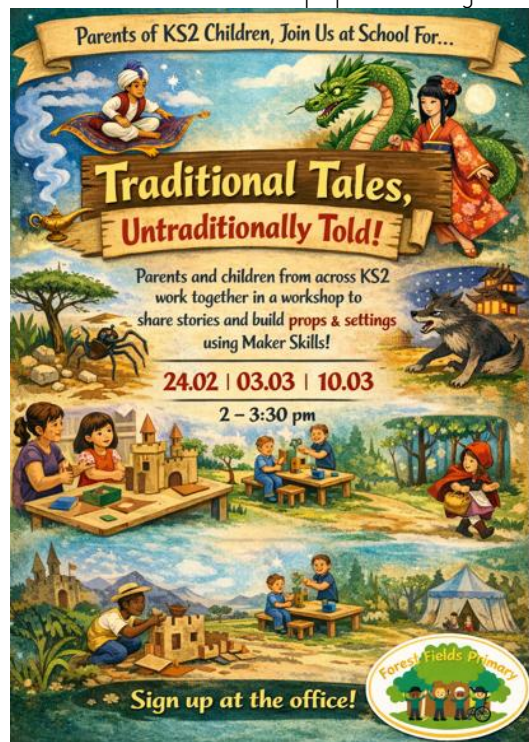

Dear parents and carers,

You may have seen news stories about the meningitis cases in Kent. We know this can be worrying but would like to reassure you that this situation is very rare, and we have not seen cases linked to the outbreak here in Nottingham. Meningitis is passed on through close contact with another person and the risk of catching it is low. However, it can be very serious if not treated quickly, so we encourage all parents and carers of children and young people and students to be aware of the signs and symptoms:

- Sudden onset of high temperature (fever)
- Severe and worsening headache
- Stiff neck
- Vomiting and diarrhoea
- Joint and muscle pain
- Dislike of bright lights
- Very cold hands and feet
- Seizures (fits)
- Confusion/delirium
- Extreme sleepiness/difficulty waking
- A rash that doesn't fade when pressed with a glass

MenB vaccines are only available on the NHS to those aged under 2 years, unless you are in the specific groups being offered it in response to the Kent outbreak. Other free vaccines also protect against diseases that can cause meningitis. We encourage families and young people to check whether they have missed any of their routine vaccinations. You can do this by contacting your GP practice online or by phone.

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Meningitis

Meningitis is a serious condition where the protective layers around the brain and spinal cord become inflamed. It can happen to anyone, so it's important to know the symptoms and risks.

Early symptoms, such as fever, vomiting, aches, muscle pain, cold hands and feet and headaches, can look similar to common illnesses like colds or flu. But someone with meningitis will usually become seriously ill in a matter of hours. That's why it's crucial to keep checking on anyone who is unwell.

Symptoms

- Sudden onset of high fever
- severe and worsening headache
- stiff neck
- vomiting and diarrhoea
- joint and muscle pain
- dislike of bright lights
- very cold hands and feet
- seizures
- confusion/delirium
- extreme sleepiness/difficulty waking
- a rash that doesn't fade when pressed with a glass.

If you become worried about yourself, your child, or a friend, particularly if symptoms are getting worse, seek medical help urgently. Early treatment can be life-saving.




MENINGITIS + SEPTICAEMIA

Meningitis is a serious condition where the protective layers around the brain and spinal cord become inflamed. Septicaemia is when the bacteria enter the bloodstream to cause blood poisoning. They can happen to anyone, so it's important to know the symptoms and risks.

Early symptoms, such as fever, vomiting, aches, muscle pain, cold hands and feet and headaches, can look similar to common illnesses like colds or flu. But someone with meningitis or septicaemia will usually become seriously ill in a matter of hours. That's why it's crucial to keep checking on anyone who is unwell.

MENINGITIS SYMPTOMS?

- fever
- a very bad headache (this alone is not a reason to get medical help)
- vomiting
- stiff neck
- dislike of bright lights
- rash (DO NOT wait for a rash to appear before seeking medical advice)
- confusion, delirium
- severe sleepiness, losing consciousness
- fits

SEPTICAEMIA SYMPTOMS?

- fever and shivering
- severe pains and aches in limbs and joints
- vomiting
- very cold hands and feet
- pale or blotchy skin
- rapid breathing
- diarrhoea and stomach cramps
- red or purple "bruised" or blotchy rash on skin that does not fade under pressure - do the glass test. On dark skin, check paler areas of the skin, such as the palms of the hands, soles of the feet, inside the mouth (roof), and the eyelids
- difficulty walking or standing
- severe sleepiness, losing consciousness

If you become worried about yourself, your child, or a friend, particularly if symptoms are getting worse, seek medical help urgently.

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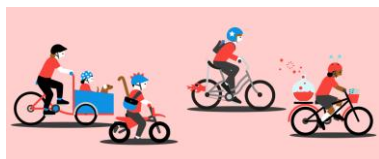
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Bike-ability

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Message regarding attendance from Miss Horton

Good Attendance at School is very important, every child should be in school EVERYDAY. It is the responsibility of Parents and Carers to notify the school when your child is absent. Where we have received no communication, home visits will be conducted on that day.

Minor illness such as a headache, tummy ache and coughs and colds are not reason to be absent from school. Please give medication where needed and bring your child into school. If they become unwell, we will call you.

Illness Guide for Parents

On the occasions that your child is feeling unwell, it can sometimes be challenging to know whether your child is well enough to attend school or whether their illness may spread to others. Please use the simple guide below to assess whether your child is able to come to school.



Come to School

Please send your child to school if they are experiencing any of the following:

- Sore throat
- Cold
- Cough
- Feeling tired
- Hay fever
- Achy or sore limbs

Children can still take part in learning when experiencing any of the above. Give them medication if you feel they need it at the beginning of the day.

We have first aiders on-site for support if needed.

School will always contact you if your child is ill during the school day.



Come to School, But Let us Know

Please send your child to school and inform the office if they are experiencing one of the following:

- Headache
- Feeling sick
- Stomach ache
- Ear ache
- Toothache
- Experiencing feeling of anxiety
- Twisted, sprained or broken limbs

Children can still take part in learning when experiencing any of the above. Give them medication if you feel they need it at the beginning of the day.

Students can speak with their year leader or a trusted adult.



Stay at Home

Unfortunately, there are some rare instances when your child will be too unwell to attend school due to an illness or injury. In the following instances, please keep your child at home:

- Temperature over 38 degrees
- Sickness and diarrhea
- Contagious illness (e.g., Chicken pox, impetigo)
- Operations/medical treatments

Medical evidence should be provided to school wherever possible to ensure that the absence is authorized.

Should your child be absent for more than 5 days, we request that you provide supporting evidence from a medical professional.

Please leave an absence voicemail on the student line as soon as possible if your child is not well enough to attend school that day.

Please do all you can to get here on time every day, if you need any support please let us know.

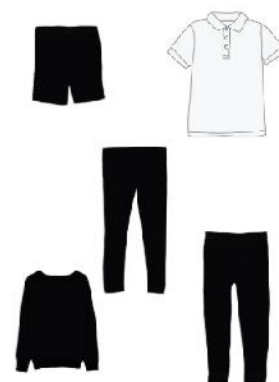
School PE kit

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Attendance & appointments

Please could you try to book appointments for children out of school hours to avoid missing school. If this is not possible, please ensure you bring your child into school on the day of the appointment and then come back to pick them up for their appointment nearer to the time. This ensures that children's learning loss is minimized and they can also book their school lunch.

If you return your child to school in the afternoon following an appointment, please be aware the time the afternoon sessions start is 1.15 p.m.

Lateness

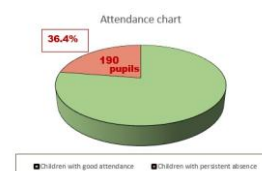
Please can you ensure your child is on time. Children are expected to arrive at school between 8.40am-9.00am (RMC time) daily. The school day starts at 9.00am and gates are closed then. Children arriving in school after 9.00am will be expected to sign in at the school office. Children arriving in school between 9.00am-9.15am will be considered late and will be issued with a late (L) mark in the register. The register closes at 9.15am and therefore any child arriving in school after 9.15am will be considered persistently late and will be issued with an unauthorised absence mark (U).

We are having a rise in children arriving late to school, which has an impact on their learning. Regular latecomers are being monitored. If you are experiencing difficulties with punctuality and would like to talk to us about it, please make an appointment with the school office, to see the Deputy Headteacher Miss Hayden, or the Attendance Officer, Meena Rana.

Persistent Absence

An absence is defined as a persistent absence "Where absence escalates and pupils miss 10% or more of school (equivalent to 1 day or more a fortnight across a full school year)" (Working together to improve school attendance Guidance for maintained schools, academies, independent schools, and local authorities, Sept 2022)

The chart shows how many children we have who are persistently absent. Please Parents and Carers, we need your help to reduce the number of children who are persistently absent by bringing your child/ children to school every day.

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Our School Development Plan for 2025 - 2026

Every year we create a new School Development Plan, based on improving provision and outcomes for our children. Please see our summary on a page, that shows what we're doing to improve our school this year.

SDP on a page (A child's view)

Insistent, persistent, consistent

With attendance we want children to attend school every day, to meet our target of 95%

We are continuing to achieve the OPAL platinum award.

In Year 1, we want all children to pass the national phonics screening test to help them with their reading and accessing the curriculum.

In reading we want to children to love reading as many non-fiction and fiction books as they can. This will help them to develop their vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension.

All our staff will be trained to be trauma informed and attachment aware by TISCUK, so all adults in school are emotionally available for all our children to support them further.

We will continue to be working with Nottingham Music Hub, Beatfeet, Historic England, Arts Mark, NST networks, Classics for All, Nottingham Trent University and the University of Nottingham to develop cultural capital about the world around us.

In English, we will be focussing on teaching oracy as we want all children to be confident with speaking by knowing how to make themselves heard and how they use their voice and body to do this, how to answer questions, how to add challenge, use a variety of speaking stems which will develop vocabulary, how to use different types of talk, and how to speak and engage with people around them in various ways.

What are we doing to improve our school this year?

In writing, children will be orally rehearsing what they would like to write, and apply age related grammar knowledge to their writing. We will be insisting that handwriting is as neat as can be, that children are persistent with their spelling and that children are consistent with oracy and apply what they have read to their writing.

We will be ensuring that oracy is incorporated in all subjects, and teaching is adapted for all learners, including pupils with PP, SEND & EAL.

This year our school Governors will be continuing to support the school by making visits with Subject Leads to see how oracy is incorporated, & teaching is adapted in all subjects, with a particular focus on pupils with PP, SEND & EAL.

We created our school mantra: **Work hard. Be Kind. Take Pride.** This was taken from the posters about our school rules of being ready, respectful & safe.

We want to make sure that all pupils make excellent progress and are ready for their next stage of learning.

In Maths, we want children to be fluent with recalling number facts through KIRFs (Key Instant Recall Facts), and through practising their times tables knowledge by using 'rolling numbers'. Please can children practise their KIRFs per half term, 'rolling numbers' & TTRS.

In the Foundation Stage, we want children to learn their phonics and apply these to reading. We want children to speak confidently. We would like all children to be confident writers. We want all children to learn through play and learning led continuous provision.

We will continue to develop characteristics of GDPPIR: gratitude, duty, personal responsibility, provision, respectful behaviour & resilience.

We will be continuing to increase the number of children achieving the expected standard, and greater depth standard, in reading, writing, grammar, maths and science in all year groups.

Our pupil school leaders will make sure that children's voices are heard and they are involved in different projects across school.
